I am sure I have shared some of this story with you before, but felt it was the right time to revisit these simple thoughts on Stewardship.

I remember the first time my Sam made some money babysitting for friends. Scott shared with him in a conversation that it was a good idea to return to God a portion of his earnings. He told him that scripture spoke of a tithe. He said that meant for every dollar he earned he would give 10 cents to the Church. I will forever remember the sparkle in his eyes and the look on his face, "That means I get to keep 90 cents? I like that deal dad!"

What is the right amount to give to the church? I honestly don't have a simple answer. I know that with some of my giving I get my name on a list if I give above a certain amount. That motivates some to stretch their giving to get on the list. We don't have such a list at Church. The reward you receive in giving a meaningful gift to your church is knowing that you have contributed what you could to a community that offers all it has to everyone regardless of what they are able to give.

Who could have foreseen the crazy year and a half we have endured. We had to fundamentally change much of how we worshipped, fellowshiped and served. And through it all you have continued to faithfully care for, pray for and

love each other. I trust that God will encourage us in 2022 to dream big, find spiritual growth and seek new and wondrous ways to serve our community. Your pledge has never been more important as we move forward into 2022.

As far as I can recall the only person Jesus praised for her giving was the poor widow. The story says that Jesus praised her because he watched many people give great sums for the temple ministry but he knew that those large sums were just a small portion of what they had. The poor widow gave abundantly out of the little she had.

What I know for sure is that God will not love you more if you give more, or less if you have less to give. God loves you unconditionally. Your pledge to the church is your way of loving God back. I find that compelling and full of possibility.

Amidst all the conversation out there today about the church and shrinking numbers and the need to change, I am still convinced that at the heart of a world that can feel weary the church is here to love, heal, feed, and serve. We are here to share God's love and that should never change.

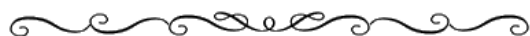
Unity Garden

I hope that we can all share some "Thankful" stories from our time apart because of the pandemic. We will enjoy food, fellowship, and fun too!

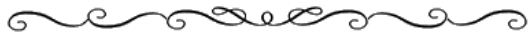
We will also collect the Jackson-Feild gifts at that time.

Neighborhood Brunch October 30, 2021

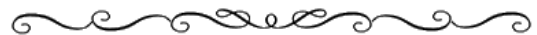
"I was glad when they said to me, 'Let us go into the house of the Lord.'" "For the sake of my brethren and companions, I will now say, 'Peace be within you.'"

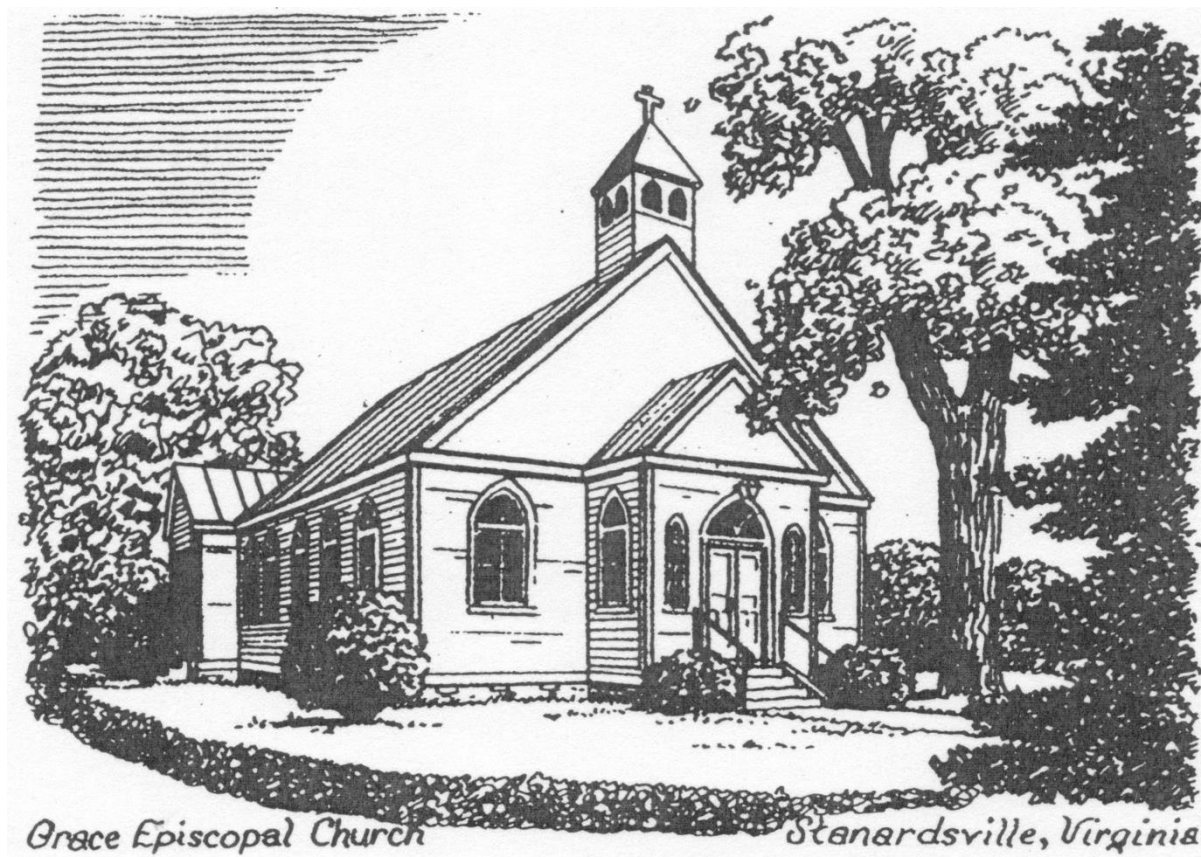
