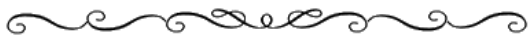

Time To Wake Up

After three months of rest, sometimes under a cover of snow, it's time for the Unity Garden to wake up. This year's farthest row will be tilled in preparation for starting potatoes, some red, some white or golden. Other rows are ready for cold weather beets, chard, spinach, and lettuce.

Inside homes, seeds are poked into tiny pots under grow lights until after the last frost when plants can thrive outdoors.

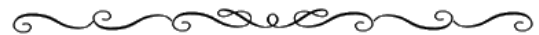
Meanwhile we inventory available seeds, then order according to the garden plan. This is the time to keep an eye out for weeds. They need to be pulled out before their roots take hold.

How might we describe this ministry? Words like dedicated, considerate, and gentle come to mind.

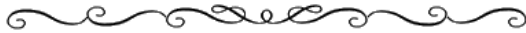
Here is a quote from "Preparing a Place" by Barbara Gent and Betty Sturges: "The place becomes a holy place again and again when love is in the preparation."

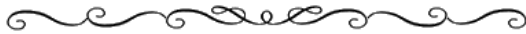
Bell Choir

ECW Virtual Lenten Retreat

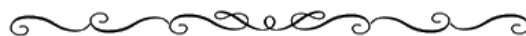
